## Whitestown Town Council Meeting February 10, 2016

**Eric M** calls the February 10, 2016, Town Council Meeting to order at 7:04 pm. **Roll Call:** Susan Austin, Clinton Bohm, Eric Miller, Kevin Russell, Jeff Wishek; Present. Presentation of Colors; Pledge.

### **B. Public Hearing – Ordinance 2016-04**

- a. Consideration of Ordinance Approving an Additional Appropriation for Parks (Farm Heritage Trail, Feasibility Study)
  - i. No public comment



- ii. Not for Feasibility Study
- iii. **Eric M** made motion to close Public Hearing, **Susan A** 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-0, ***motion passed*** and ***Public Hearing closed at 7:26pm.***
- iv. **Kevin R** asked to clarify if it included feasibility study. **Parks and Recreation Director Nathan Messer** answered questions of the transfer of the appropriation; \$40K was approved out of park impact fees. Department of Natural Resources (DNR) will reimburse for trail later.
- v. **Eric M** to the Parks Board that such requests should come from the board, not a staff member, since it is a governing body.
- vi. **Clinton B** did first read, **Susan A** made motion to suspend 2<sup>nd</sup> reading rules. **Clinton B** 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-0, ***rules suspended.***
- vii. **Susan A** made motion to accept Ordinance 2016-04, **Clinton B** 2<sup>nd</sup> motion. Vote 5-0, ***Ordinance 2016-04 passed.***

**C. Consideration of an Ordinance Amending Ordinance 2008-12: An Ordinance Prohibiting Smoking in Public Places**

- a. Includes all Town property – including parks
- b. Includes electronic cigarettes and cigars
- c. **Kevin R** questioned if there would be a fine schedule for violations.
  - 1. \$50 per violation. **Town Counsel Steven Unger** stated this is the norm.
  - 2. **Kevin R** asked if we could go to a progressive fine for repeat offenders.
    - a. **Steve U** stated a progressive fine only to business owners allowing it.
  - 3. **Susan A** made motion to suspend rules of 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, **Clinton B** 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-0, ***motion passed.***
  - 4. **Susan A** made motion to pass Ordinance 2016-05, **Clinton B** 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-02, ***Ordinance 216-05 adopted.***

**D. Consideration of Ordinance Amending Ordinance 2015-27: An Ordinance Establishing Wages and Salaries for the Town**

- a. Read by **Clinton B**
- b. Suggested it be adopted based on Planning Commission needing to meet more and providing more service needed due to Town growth
- c. **Kevin R** agreed and requested we make it retroactive to 1/1/2016.
  - i. **Clinton B** asked for clarification from **Steve U**; **Steve U** said it could be paid retroactive as long as it did not exceed the earnings amount.
- d. **Kevin R** made motion to suspend rule for 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, **Clinton B** 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-0, ***motion passed to suspend rules.***
- a. **Clinton B** made motion to pass Ordinance 2016-06, **Susan A** 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-0, ***Ordinance 2016-06 adopted.***

- a. Clinton B did the first read. Susan A made a motion to adopt, Clinton B 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-0, *Resolution 2016-12 adopted.*

- a. Susan A did first read. Clinton B made motion to adopt, Susan A 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-0, *Resolution 2016-13 adopted.*
- K. Consideration Approval of Low Bid Recommendation for the I-65/Exit 130 Project**
- a. Dax N recommends Council approve the low bid of \$1,080,000.00 from Calumet pending receipt of the certified bid tab and the INDOT funding commitment letter.
    - i. Have permit from the state already.
    - ii. Susan A asked if it is just for actual construction, and Dax N said "yes."
    - iii. Kevin R wanted to know when ground could be broke.
    - iv. Kevin R wanted clarification if work would be done at night.
    - v. Susan A questioned if there were penalties for missing deadlines.
  - b. Susan A made motion to accept bid, Clinton B 2<sup>nd</sup>. Vote 5-0, *bid accepted.*
- L. Discuss Community Center Feasibility Study RFQ**
- a. RFQS
    - i. Kevin R questioned who requested RFQs, and Nathan M replied the Parks did.
  - b. Susan A made motion to table due to budget needing cut and also due to discussions being made and not everyone involved in those discuss. Eric M stated that was smart to do if needing to cut funds. Susan A stated needed an internal discussion. Kevin R concerned if RFQ has an aquatic center and needing



something different, like an ice rink. **Clinton B 2<sup>nd</sup>** and though likes comments, he would like to hear more from the Parks Board on this and get input from the appropriate people. Vote 5-0, ***motioned adopted to table.***

**A. Infrastructure Projects**

- a. Median moving on schedule despite weather. **Kevin R** thought there would be a left hand turn. **Dax N** stated for safety there is no turn lane because it would be too dangerous because of being so close to light. Signage will be allowed. Discussions underway with REMC on lighting the median with LED lights.
- b. Access road open and complete, but needs a name.
- c. Round-about
  - i. **Dan C, Jason L, and Brian** went to meeting regarding. Funding is moving forward.
  - ii. Getting closer to land acquisition.

**B. Indianapolis Road Trail**

- a. **Jason L, Dax N and Nathan M** discussed way to fund trail and feel it could be done under \$140K
- b. **Steve U** will review IRS money and eligibility
- c. New neighborhood could possibly bring in \$80K in park impact revenue fees to use Town Hall Bond.

    - 5. 1.21 to 1.09 – 10% tax decrease
    - 6. **Kevin R** asked if our tax cut was lower than surrounding communities; **Dax N** said hasn't received final news on that as of yet.
